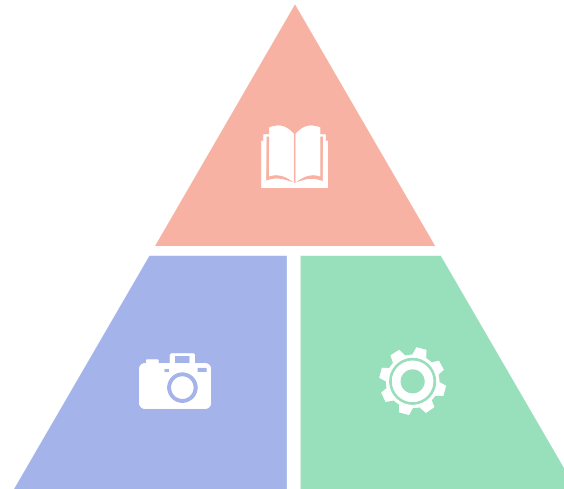


Beit Horon

The Baha'i gardens

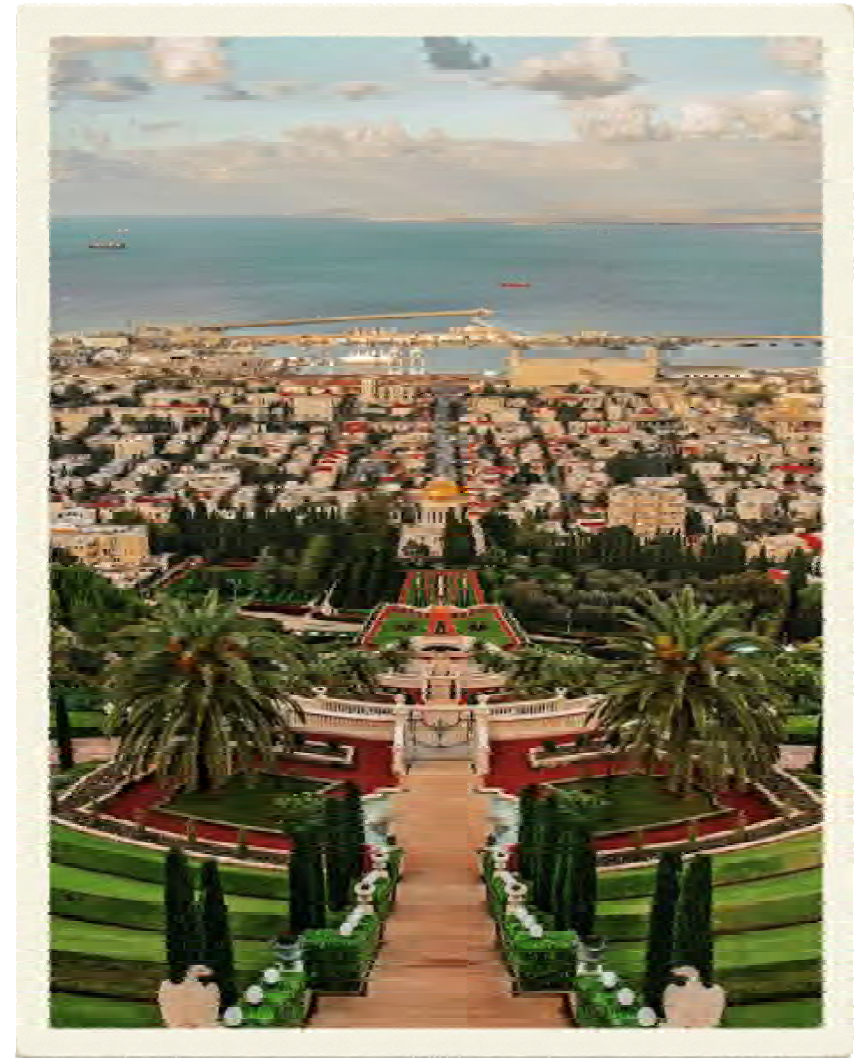
The beautiful terraces of the Bahai Gardens, a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

The **Bahai** faith started under 200 years ago by a Persian name **Siyyid Ali Muhammad Shirazi** who revealed himself as the **prophet Bab** ("gate" in Arabic). He was shunned by the **Shia** clergy (despite gaining tens of thousands of followers) and was eventually executed, only six years after he began his movement

His efforts were continued by **Mirza Husayn Ali Nuri** who chose the name **Baha'u'llah**.

In 1868, Baha'u'llah was banished to one of the Ottoman Empire's most infamous prisons located in **Akko** (Acre).

He was eventually allowed to purchase a house and live out the rest of his days in relative peace.
